A very dedicated chamber musician, Olwen has been part of the Regency String Quartet since 2022, with whom she has performed in numerous concerts across the UK. They have been a part of the ASSET scheme since 2022, and in 2023, they were awarded the Wolfe Wolfinston String Quartet Prize. They were also selected to represent the Academy at the Hong Kong Music Festival, which was kindly supported by the Elton John Global Exchange Program. She also regularly performs with the London Concertante Chamber Orchestra, as well as numerous other chamber groups.

Olwen has received masterclasses from numerous notable musicians, such as Prof. Marco Rizzi, Alina Ibragimova, Jack Liebeck, Paola Tumeo, Gregory Sandomirsky, James Ehnes, and Kirill Troussov.

She has received the generous loan of a Testore 1767 violin from the Royal Academy of Music Strings Museum.
